Kokua: to help

The purpose of this award is to recognize those Arizona residents that foster better understanding of and generate direct impact upon both Polynesian peoples and the community at large.

Kokua Awardees have helped the Polynesian community by perpetuating their culture through one or more strings of knowledge that weave together to keep a people's history alive.

Examples include:

- Music
- Song
- Dance
- Arts
- Crafts
- Storytelling
- Language
- Sport
- Knowledge of cultural ceremonies
- Knowledge of history
- Knowledge of myths and legends
- Knowledge of plant uses

Awardees also reach out to the Greater Phoenix and/or Arizona community at large through leadership and service. Service can include one or more of the following areas:

- Education
- Humanitarian efforts
- Volunteerism
- Leadership

It is this unique combination of cultural knowledge applied through leadership and service to the community that defines the Kokua Awardee.

Award Process

Nomination forms should be sent to the Arizona Aloha Festivals, Inc. Board of Directors to the attention of the President, Mr. Varen Berryman. The Board reviews the nominations and selects an awardee.

Nominators should provide as much information as possible in the requested areas. Supplemental information in the form of attachments or enclosures is allowed, but selection will be based upon the responses in the specific areas.

Award selection will be completed by the end of December each year.
